

## Purcell Lodge Rescue Plan Lodge Duties

Purcell Lodge has a three-tier emergency response plan that requires support and assistance from the lodge. It is the responsibility of the lodge staff to relay information from the guide(s) to outside sources for additional support and/or helicopter evacuation. The lodge will also record the time of events and radio calls for the accident report, assist with preparing rescue equipment for transport, and attend to guests and/or patients returning to the lodge.

### Plan Alpha

A plan Alpha is an accident/incident that can be dealt with entirely by Purcell Lodge staff. The helicopter company will be contacted and informed that if circumstances change Purcell Lodge will be requesting a non-life threatening medical evacuation.

### Plan Bravo

A plan Bravo is a call for a helicopter evacuation of a non-life threatening injury. The call in should provide you with:

The nature of the emergency.

The location of the patient, either by the attached run list and elevation or by UTM coordinates.

How the patient will be prepared for transport ie, on a backboard, sitting, etc.

Whether the helicopter needs to land at Purcell Lodge to pick up any additional personnel or rescue equipment first.

In the event of a long line rescue, Purcell Lodge staff will defer to all rules and protocols established by the helicopter company.

If poor weather or approaching darkness may prevent helicopter support, all guides should be notified to prepare for self rescue and ground transport.

### Plan Charlie

A plan Charlie is a very serious or life threatening emergency that requires the fastest response, safely possible by all parties. The call for this emergency should include:

The nature of the emergency.

The location of the patient/event, either by the attached run list and elevation or by UTM coordinates.

If additional resources need to be flown in

How the patient(s) will be prepared for transport ie, on a backboard, sitting, etc.

Whether the helicopter needs to land at Purcell Lodge to pick up any additional personnel or rescue equipment first.

If poor weather or approaching darkness may prevent helicopter support, all guides should be notified to prepare for self rescue and ground transport.

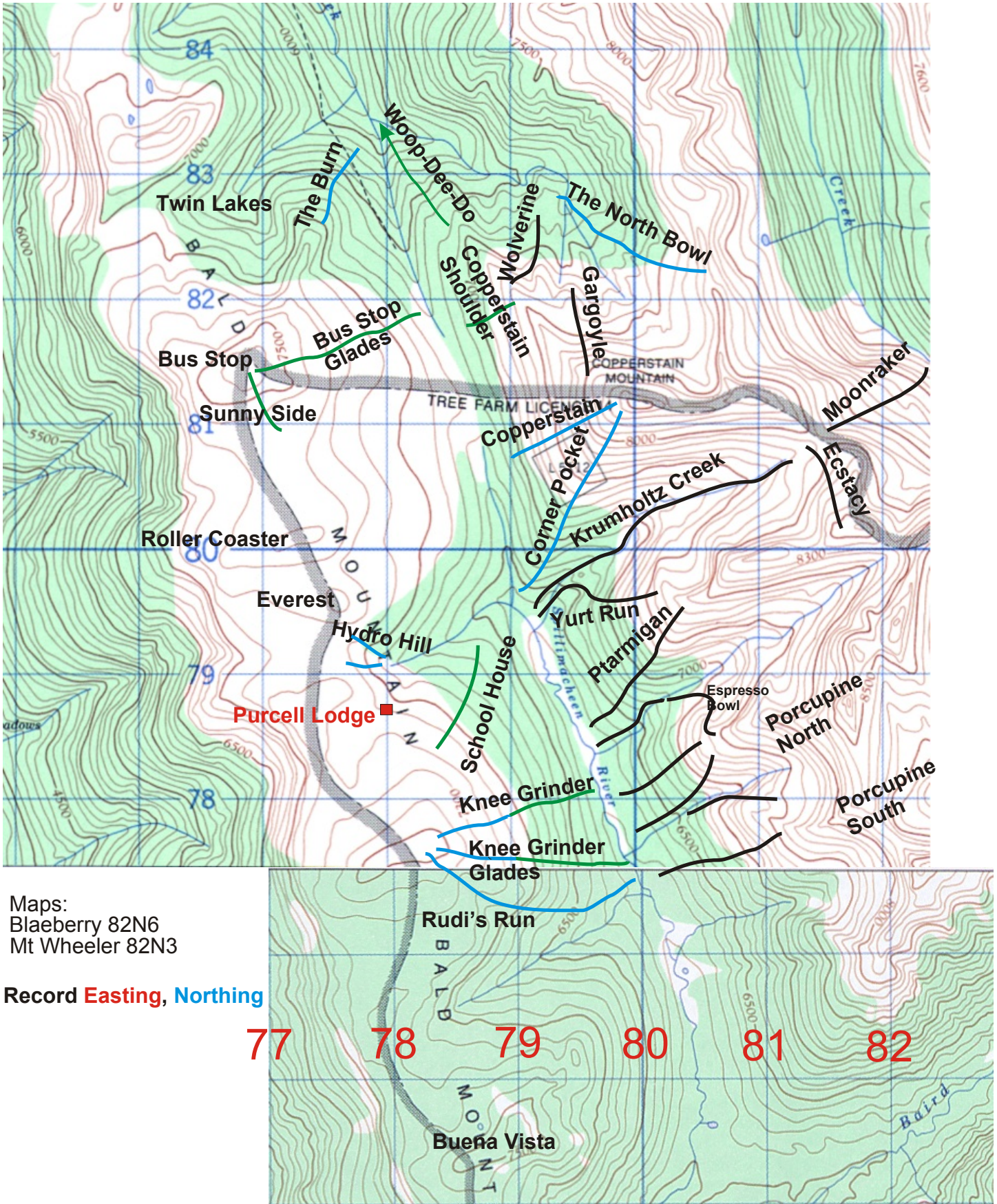
